ANN: 그럼 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 구입할 화장대를 고르세요.

M: Hello, ma'am. How may I help you?

W: Hi, I'd like to buy a dressing table for my daughter.

M: We have one on display at this store. Would you like to look at it?

W: You mean that one? The oval-shaped mirror looks too old-fashioned.

M: Then, please take a look at this catalogue. How about one of these with a rectangular mirror? They're the most popular items among girls these days.

W: I like the one with shelves next to the mirror. My daughter can put her perfume bottles on the shelves.

M: So what do you think?

W: Well, I don't like the cabinet at the bottom right.

M: I see. How about this one with three drawers? It also has shelves beside the mirror.

W: It looks good. I'll take it.

M: Great. You'll receive it in a week. Thank you so much.

2번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심경 변화로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Hey, Jake. Is there anything good on TV?

M: Yeah, there's a baseball game between the Dragons and the Raiders. You know I'm a fan of the Raiders.

W: Are they winning?

M: Yes. They're ahead nine to six with two innings to go. Wow! Johnson just hit a home run.

W: Oh, wait a minute. I think I've seen this before. This isn't a live broadcast.

M: What do you mean?

W: They're showing the game that was played last Wednesday.

M: Then you must know how the game ends. The Raiders won, right?

W: Well, I don't want to spoil it for you.

M: I won't get angry at you for spoiling it. The Raiders won, right? Tell me, please.

W: Well, if you insist... The Dragons beat the Raiders.

M: Oh, no. I shouldn't have asked.

3번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Nice to see you again. Our beverage has been a great success, thanks to you.

M: Oh, I'm flattered. But the product itself was really good, both in taste and design.

W: Thanks. Anyway, let's get down to business. We want you to make the advertisement for our new product again.

M: No problem. What is it this time?

W: It's pumpkin juice.

M: Pumpkin juice? How interesting! It sounds like a health drink.

W: Yeah, but we're targeting young female consumers rather than the elderly so I want the ad to be more appealing to a younger audience.

M: I see. When would you like it ready?

W: Well, we're planning to bring this drink onto the market in three weeks. So, the ad should be ready to go on the air one week before that.

M: OK. I'll show you the outline soon.

W: Great. I'm sure it'll be a big hit.

4번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불해야 할 금액을 고르세요.

M: Willow Auto Camping Site. How may I help you?

W: I'd like to reserve a site for camping next week.

M: How many nights will you be staying?

W: Two nights. How much is it per night?

M: We charge 30 dollars for the first night and half price for each additional night.

W: So, the second night is 15 dollars. That sounds good.

M: How many people will there be?

W: Two adults and three children.

M: The original price covers a family of four. You're one person over, so the total will cost 5 dollars more. Would you like to rent a tent?

W: No, thanks. We'll bring our own tent and equipment. Are pets allowed on the camping site?

M: Yes, they are. Under what name do you want the reservation?

W: Jennifer Yoon. Thanks.

5번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 전화를 건 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Hello, Bennet University Admissions Office.

M: Hello, may I talk to the person in charge of admissions?

W: This is she. How may I help you?

M: My name is Michael Elliott. I'm calling to check if you received all my documents, including my revised letter of recommendation.

W: You mean you sent us another letter?

M: Yes. My professor wrote the wrong date on the first letter, so he had to write another one.

W: Could you tell me when he sent it to us?

M: Probably the day before yesterday. If you find it, could you please replace the old one with the new one?

W: Let me check if I have it. *[pause]* Hmm... We have all your documents but we haven't received the new letter yet.

M: Really? Oh, my. The application deadline is tomorrow. What can I do then?

W: If we don't receive it, we'll call your professor directly and ask him to send the letter by fax.
